


A Brief History of Biblical Christianity

The LAMB was slain before the foundation of the world (Rev. 17:8).

The resurrected glorious LAMB is worshipped (Rev. 5).



2. God created the heavens and earth out of nothing (Genesis 1:1).

3. The first humans were created in God's image (Genesis 1:26):

- Free moral agents,
- Intelligent (Genesis 2:19).

4. Adam and Eve were allowed to be tempted (Gen. 3). Under God's sovereign control and for his purpose, they disobeyed.

Their sinful nature was passed on to all future generations.

5. God went looking for Adam and Eve and announced his eternal plan of salvation (Genesis 3:15).

6. Adam's son, Cain, responded to his sinful nature... killed his brother (Gen. 4:8).

7. Adam's son, Seth, by God's grace started a godly line (Genesis 5:3).

8. Cave men came after Adam and Eve... result of sin.

9. World population increased, prone to sin, resulting in God's judgement with a world-wide flood (Genesis 6:11-12).

10. God's grace was shown by saving Noah and his family to repopulate the earth (Genesis 9:1).

11. God called Abraham to fulfil his plan of salvation through the promised Messiah (Genesis 12:1-3).

12. God continued his plan through Isaac, Jacob and his twelve sons. Some 400 years later, Moses led God's people out of Egypt and instituted the Passover—a lamb's blood is shed to pay for sin (Exodus 12).

13. In 1000 B.C. David, as king of Israel, was promised the Messiah would come through his line (2 Samuel 7:12).

14. When God's time came, the Messiah's birth was announced... to be named Jesus (Matthew 1:21).

15. Jesus proved his divinity by his life, words and works (John 10:33).

16. Jesus allowed himself to be crucified, shed his blood, and to give them eternal life (John 3:16).

17. After Jesus' resurrection, he commanded his disciples to take the message of salvation throughout the world... which is still continuing (Acts 1:8).

18. The Bible promises that the glorious Lord Jesus will come back from heaven, bring the souls of Christians with him, and reunite them with their resurrected bodies (2 Thessalonians 4:13-18).

19. Christians still living will be given resurrected bodies, and be reunited with other believers and with the Lord Jesus for all eternity (1 Corinthians 15:50f).
